# A WORD FROM OUR DIRECTOR

**Sending you warm wishes this holiday season from all of us at Kids FIRST!** While this last year was still a difficult one for our community, we feel hopeful for the future. Our child clients consistently humble us and remind us why this work is important— they show us what it means to be brave and resilient each day.

This year was a surprisingly typical one for our caseload. While many other Children's Advocacy Centers (CACs) in the state and across the nation saw a decline in cases, Kids FIRST's service numbers remained steady. I'm certain that our larger facility is part of the reason for this—we are able to serve multiple families a day while still observing COVID-19 safety protocols. But that's not all. Mandatory reporting decreased during the pandemic—yet we still received reports and referrals. I would like to think this is a testament to our connectedness as a community— teachers, neighbors, law enforcement, community and family members— we are looking out for children and we are making reports, even when the pandemic made it challenging to do so. While it's not a perfect system by any means, our work together will continue to help keep our kids safe.

Our team is passionate about serving kids and families and we have been working to thoughtfully grow our organization. Truthfully, we have been understaffed for some time, but excitingly, now that we have space in our building that was renovated in 2019, we are bringing on additional team members to help support the high volume of children utilizing our services. We are one of the highest volume CACs in the state, but we have significantly fewer team members than our sister-centers. We know that having the appropriate number of staff to serve kids is important for their healing, and for our continued growth and stability. For all of these reasons, staffing and program growth will be the focus of our efforts in 2022.

If you are reading this, I know it's because you've connected with Kids FIRST and offered support in some way. We are thankful for you and your willingness to boldly support our mission. With your helping heart, and our team of professionals ready to serve— **healing is possible!**



Cost of intervention services for one child










#### Did you know?

Kids FIRST is an Accredited Children's Advocacy Center through National Children's Alliance, and we underwent the rigorous Re-Accreditation process this year. This means that Kids FIRST meets all 10 of NCA's Standards for Accredited members. The Standards, which are updated every 5 years based on the latest science, aim to ensure that all children across the U.S. served by CACs receive consistent, evidence-based services that help them heal from abuse.
